The first experience on the quarter-mile track for Danny was on his Buell at the age of 17. He would race at the Kansas City International Raceway every Wednesday and Friday night during the season. He loved it and has never looked back.

*One evening during his ride home from KCIR Danny had an accident. The bike was left in 3 pieces and Danny had broken his leg in 2 locations. He was in the hospital for 4 days and was on bed rest for 6 months. The bed rest would prove to only add to Danny's desire to race.*

Over the next 6 months as Danny was healing up he would watch the NHRA (National Hot Rod Association) events on T.V. Although the name implies "Hot Rods" they also have motorcycle division races. Again, Danny was even more intent on racing as he watched these racers.
