### WILMINGTON: Directions and Attractions

#### Myrtle Beach to Wilmington Ride Routes

- (1) Follow 17 N for approximately 70 miles and merge onto 74/76 E in to Wilmington.
  - a. Highlight: Most Direct Route
  - b. Mileage 80 miles
- (2) 501 N to 701 N (Conway) to 74/76 E (Whiteville) into Wilmington.
  - a. Highlight: Chance to ride through several small SC towns. Longest route
  - b. Mileage: 110 miles
- (3) 17 N to 211 N/W (Supply) to 74/76 E (near Bolton) into Wilmington.
  - a. Highlight: 24-mile stretch from Supply to Bolton in rural NC
  - b. Mileage: 105 miles
- (4) 17 N to 211 N/W (Supply) to 87 N (Southport) to 133 N to 74/76 E into Wilmington.
  - a. Highlight: Chance to ride along the coast and the Cape Fear River
  - b. Mileage: 105 miles

#### To Carolina Coast Harley-Davidson

Take 74/76 E and then turn left on 74 E/17 N/S 17<sup>th</sup> St. Turn Right on 74 E/17 BR 17 N. Continue to follow 17 E for 5 miles and the dealership is located at 6620 Market St. 910-791-9997. [www.cchd.com](http://www.cchd.com)

#### TOP ATTRACTIONS IN DOWNTOWN WILMINGTON

**Battleship North Carolina** – located downtown on the Cape Fear River. This vessel is dedicated to the more than 10,000 North Carolinians who gave their lives during WWII. A must see. 910-251-5797

**Chandler's Warf** – Located at 225 S. Water Street is an 1870s mercantile warehouse that was destroyed by fire in 1874. It was re-built and now is home to bustling shopping and dining district. A great place to visit. 910-343-9896.

**First Baptist Church** – 411 Market Street. Wilmington's tallest church and the first Baptist church in the region, opening in 1870. Check out the 197-ft. steeple. 910-763-2471.

**Oakdale Cemetery** – 529 N. 15<sup>th</sup> Street. Wilmington's first municipal burial ground, was opened in 1855 and features many curious, beautiful and historic markers. 910-763-2471.

**The Riverwalk** – Riverfront Park, along Water Street. This is the heart and soul of downtown. Enjoy history great food, shopping and watch the ships go by.

**Wilmington National Cemetery** – 201 Market Street. Established in 1867 to honor the soldiers of the Civil War. Contains more than 2,000 Union soldiers 1,300 of which are unidentified. 910-815-4877.
