Recently I attended a meeting jointly hosted by Buffalo Niagara Riverkeeper and the City of Buffalo. The best part was the view of the harbor and Lake Erie from the 37th floor of HSBC Center. From this bird's eye view you could see how much vacant or underutilized land there is and thus the opportunity for development of the Buffalo River and Inner and Outer Harbors. The various presentations made by local, State and US Government officials provided a better understanding of what is going to take place to remediate the River and to develop the adjacent land. It is natural to be skeptical of the future because we have been waiting so long for things to happen on the waterfront. In the current economic climate money is harder to come by from all sectors. It does appear, however, that progress will be made, just don't ask for a firm timetable!

Regular readers of this newsletter will recall that I have complained about the fact that there are too many boatshows. This results in poorly attended shows with too few boats and lousy results for the vendors. The NMMA has come to realize this and there is a push to reduce the number of shows so that the ones that remain will be better for everyone, customers and dealers alike.

Proposals are not done willy nilly by the State; the large wind companies have already done their engineering studies of geographical location and lobbied NY State politicians for these projects. Proposed project sizes are often understated in many ways. There are lots of very negative issues and consequences that Lake Ontario boaters, plus homeowners near the lake will face from this huge wind farm. NY REQUIRES LIFE JACKETS FOR COLD WEATHER BOATERS Starting Nov. 1, kayakers, canoeists and those aboard all other boats under 21 feet must wear Coast Guard-approved personal flotation devices while on New York's coastal waters, lakes, rivers and other waterways. The rule will remain in effect through May 1. Violators face fines ranging from \$25 to \$100.

Wonderful trawler style layout. The guest cabin is forward, with private head to port. The head has a sink with vanity, head and shower. The companionway to the guest cabin closes off for complete privacy. The salon is very bright with an open feeling and features teak cabinetry, teak and holly sole, and large windows and sliding doors port and starboard for access to the side decks. Visibility is excellent at the inside helm station on starboard which features a convenient fold-away helm seat and sliding door. There is a large L-shaped settee to port with adjustable hi-lo teak table which swivels, and the dinette converts to a double berth. Opposite the dinette is a two person settee behind the helm. In the aft end of the salon is the L-shaped galley to starboard. Slightly offset companionway to the master stateroom, full size Norcold dual voltage refrigerator to port by port side sliding door.

The master stateroom is aft features 2 comfortable single berths, abundant drawer and locker storage with lighted vanity. Opening windows for light and ventilation and an aft companionway to the aft deck. On the starboard side is a full size head with sink, head and separate stall shower.

The flybridge is large with helm and companion swivel seats. There is an L-shaped dinette with table for additional seating for four. Aluminum radar mast. The aft trunk cabin top area is surrounded by a stainless steel rail. The forward deck has two large recessed anchor lockers, stainless steel bow pulpit with side rails. Nice side deck access to wide after deck with a transom door to the swim platform. A large lazarette provides space for deck gear and fenders.

The galley is very well equipped with double stainless steel sinks with hot and cold pressure water. Norcold dual-voltage full size refrigerator and freezer and a 3 burner propane stove and oven. Seaward LPG solenoid shutoff, microwave. Even the gourmet chef will appreciate that here is plenty of counter and cabinet space for food preparation and storage. The chef will also be part of the socializing during meal preparation.

"SS Meca" is a 2-owner freshwater yacht with many custom features and upgrades. She has only 1760 hours on her Twin 250 hp Detroit diesels. She has custom blue leatherette interior, two single berths in the aft cabin and v-berth forward, two heads and spacious galley up. Her current owner is an elderly gentleman and regrets that at this time in his life he has to give her up. He has enjoyed cruising aboard her. "SS Meca" has spent half her life here at Erie Yacht Club. This vessel offered at a superb value. During its successful run, Sabre built 85 of the 36 Fast Trawlers. The 36 follows their "Built in the Maine Tradition" of craftsmanship, design and quality and is still very desirable today. Erie, \$124,900

Speaking of the upcoming Thanksgiving festivities, you might add this to a list of possibles to your Holiday Table. I made this for 2 servings so you'll have to expand it for a feast:

Sautéed Acorn Squash w/nuts and raisins:

- ½ acorn squash - sliced into wedges and cut in half
- 2 TBSP Olive Oil
- 2 TBSP Butter
- ½ clove Garlic - crushed
- ¼ cup Sweet Red Pepper diced
- 1/4 Cup Chopped Walnuts, Hazelnuts or both
- 1/4 Cup Raisins
- 1/4 Cup Craisins (Dried Cranberries)
- 1 TBSP Honey
- 1 TBSP Chopped Parsley
- Sprinkle or 2 of Wegman's Herbs De Provence (A blend of Tarragon, Basil, Savory, Rosemary, Thyme, Fennel, Lavender) Use whatever you like.

In a medium sauce pan bring 3qts water to a boil...add squash for 10 minutes, drain and peel off skin.

In a medium sauté pan add olive oil, butter and garlic. When hot add squash and red pepper...coat evenly with oil and butter...medium heat...cover...stir frequently...add walnuts, Craisins and raisins...Reduce heat slightly and cook till squash softens a bit. Add honey and stir...add more butter if necessary. Finish with parsley and serve.

Hey, it was delicious...a nice compliment with some sweetness. Don't confuse me with Emiril or Wolfgang Puck though.
