Commentary:

America's Cup Comments from a couple of our readers:

"I understand your frustration with the America's Cup in it's present form. I agree with you, and hope that sense will prevail, and the Cup reverts back to it's intended purpose. In the meantime, I propose that changing the language if the Deed of the Gift only slightly would clarify the situation: Change "friendly competition between countries" to "acrimonious competition between corporate sponsors as well as the lawyers who represent them". B.H."

"Read your analysis of the America's Cup and agree 100% with you. However I did see an interesting interview that explained one good thing that may come out of this. In past cups, except the Kiwi challenge of course, the Cup was 75% crew and 25% technology (the box rule). This round they are saying its 5% crew and 95% technology. The interview with Harken was interesting to hear the amount of R&D they did for this cup (and other manufacturers), which should get passed on to production boats in future. However, I'm with you, strap on the skates and "GO CANADA GO". J.E.R"

Preparing for the 2010 Season, by Don Finkle: The first race of the local sailing season, not counting dinghy frostbiting, is only 6 weeks away! That is when NOLSC starts their Sunday afternoon spring series. The Oswego J/24 sailors begin to race in April as well. So it won't be that long before we'll be down on the boat getting it ready to splash.

Most of us have way too much going on in our lives these days, and things tend to sneak up on you. If we aren't careful we can catch ourselves unprepared. Fortunately for me, some of my crew are much better than I am at planning ahead and reminding me of what needs to be done. I'd suggest starting with the season racing calendar. If you haven't already blocked out your sailing dates you had better get started. Crew availability is one of the major factors that influence whether we can do an event or not. Make sure your crew knows what events you are doing and have them put in for the time off....now.

Hopefully you had a list at the end of last season that indicates what needs to be done before the start of the new campaign. The list should include anything on the boat that was not working properly; things that need to be upgraded, replaced or improved, such as running rigging. How are your sails? Is your rating certificate current? How about your boat measurement certificate? Are you happy with the bottom, or does

it need more work to be fast?

One way to make your boat faster is to take all of the extraneous crap off it. It is amazing how much stuff tends to accumulate during the course of the summer.

Preparation should not focus solely on the boat and its equipment, what about the skipper and crew? What have you done to improve your knowledge for the coming season? Others are working to get better, what are you doing to keep up or get an edge on the competition? Do you know the rules as well as you should? There are some excellent tools out there now for explaining the racing rules, such as Dave Dellenbaugh's DVD series.

One way to build enthusiasm among your crew is to schedule a party and crew meeting before the season begins. Aside from the thrill of competition and enjoying the time on the water, the social side of our sport is what keeps many coming back. It is never too early to feed the camaraderie.
