Commentary:

J/22 Midwinter Championship report, by Will Harris: Held at the Southern Yacht Club in New Orleans. Chris Doyle, Will Harris & Pete Doyle represented Youngstown YC on Chris's hull #1589 "Solid Layer". Here is Will's report:

"Usually when you wind up 4th in a major regatta, against a very deep fleet, you can write a regatta report extolling your blazing speed, super smart tactics and a couple of mistakes that just held you back from winning.

The 2010 J/22 mid-winters were not that regatta for team 1589. We had lousy starts, mediocre boat-handling and the fat guy in the middle was falling all over the boat (that would be me). Our speed felt just ok, but we seemed off the pace in what is normally our best condition. To compound matters, we sailed our throw-out in the very first race.

When Pete pulled out his I-phone to check results on the long sail home, there was a collective "how the % ^\$# did that happen?", when Pete announced, "Chris Doyle 4th!" I don't think anyone on the boat felt like we sailed well, certainly not well enough to be top 5 in a really tough fleet. Yet there it was, Chris Doyle 4th.

So how can you sail crappy and get a good result in a deep fleet? First, the depth of the fleet helps. There were 15 boats with a legitimate shot at winning the regatta, and a whole bunch more capable of having some good races. 8's and 9's are not gonna cut it in a 5 deep fleet but they may not be bad in a big fleet.

Second, Lake Pontchartrain is a really hard place to sail. The lake is really wide, really shallow and the color of root beer. When the wind blows, it gets choppy fast, when it blows hard the waves are huge, steep and close together. In those conditions, disaster is close at hand for even the best teams. The hardest thing about sailing on Root Beer Lake is that you simply can't see the wind on the water. You can't see it far away and you can't see puffs even a length away. I asked Benz Faget, an awesome local sailor if he could see them and he just laughed.

Those factors made it possible for us to sail bad, but score good. The fleet, the breeze, the waves and even the color of the water all made the regatta hard, really hard. It is super easy to start getting all self-pitying and imagining that it's only hard for you. It isn't; it's hard for everyone.

When pro golfers face tough conditions, or are having a bad day, you often hear them talk about 'grinding'. They give up on eagles and even birdies and fight like hell to make mostly pars and as few bogies as possible. That's essentially what we did. We turned a bunch of potential 25's into 8's or 9's, and when we slid from a good position, we were able to stop the free fall at around 8 or 9. Turns out, that was about par.

When you find yourself faced with really tough conditions, don't freak out and don't change a lot of stuff. You aren't going to win the regatta on one shift, realize that. Keep doing what you always do. Your best hope is to grind it out and hope your competition gets sucked into shooting for eagle. Will"

My East Coast Tour, by Don Finkle: "This report is a continuation of my trip to New England a couple of weeks ago. My first stop was at Hall Spars and Rigging in Bristol, RI. Hall is noted for both quality and innovation in the field of masts, booms, sprits, spinnaker poles, standing and running rigging and related hardware. They have a huge modern plant with some very impressive machinery in it. Nan Hall gave me a personal tour of the facilities, which had changed much since I was last there...they had moved twice since into ever larger and more modern plants. I was expecting a lot but what I saw was even more than I had expected.

Hall makes masts and other spars out of both aluminum and carbon fiber. Ben Hall, who was also kind enough to take some time out of his very busy day to speak to me, told me of the difference when it comes

to inventory of the two materials. If they need aluminum extrusions of a certain dimension they must order in increments of 5,000 pounds. Since there is a very wide variety of different mast shapes and sizes this can result in a lot of inventory sitting around, much of it may not be needed again for a lengthy period of time.

Carbon fiber, on the other hand, is one single material, a black filament that is used on everything they make, large and small. The same stuff works on a spinnaker pole for a 24 footer or for the mast on a 150 footer. It is expensive stuff but wonderfully flexible when it comes to what they can do with it. One basic raw material to keep in stock, a dream for inventory control! The carbon fiber is wound on a spinning mandrel with epoxy resin, and the mandrel determines the shape of the finished product. They "cook" the spars in a autoclave under heat and pressure. They have a couple of these large pressure vessels, one is huge and can cure a spar up to great length (I forgot the exact length but it is really large).

In the shop they were building a humongous mast for a J boat. Not the kind of J/boat we typically see at our clubs around here like a J/24 or J/35, but one of those monsters that were designed for the America's Cup back in the 1930's.

Hall built part of the spar for the Wing mast that BMW Oracle recently used to win the America's Cup in Spain.

There were many other spars going through of various sizes. One thing was easy to spot, however. Regardless of size the quality was outstanding.

I needed a small part for a gooseneck for Beneteau First 10R. I showed Nan the damaged part I had and she took me into their stock room and promptly pulled out a new one for me. What a candy store for the sailor! If it has to do with rigging it seems they have it. Lots and lots of colorful coils of line and rows of bins of metal parts. Everything was neat, clean and organized. You can see why they have a reputation for quality.

I have always enjoyed working with Hall Spars and Rigging because of the product and the helpfulness and knowledge of the people working there. They will be building the mast for the new 36-foot J/111 using a special nano resin that will reduce the weight of the mast over standard resin. I am sure the whole rig will be not only wonderfully engineered but also a thing of beauty."
