Fleets at RCC

The Thistle: a 17 foot long centerboard boat with three sails. It normally sails with a skipper and two crew, but can also be sailed with just two people. It is a strong nation-wide one design class which was started in the 1950's. RCC is home to Thistle Fleet 46.

The JY15: a relatively new addition to the racing scene at RCC. It is 15 feet long and carries two sails. It is raced with two people and is easy to handle. The JY-15 is a great boat for a husband/wife, parent/child or teenager team. JY15 Fleet 77 resides at RCC.

Optimists: 8 feet long, have one sail, and are sailed by one person. The boats are normally used for children of ages 7 through 15 and are also used for our Sailing Instruction program for beginning youngsters. RCC owns a fleet of five boats for the children to use.

Sunfish In addition to being a great beach boat, the Sunfish is also a great racing boat. It is 14 feet long, has one sail, and is easily sailed by one person. The Sunfish is one of the boats used for our Sailing Instruction program. RCC is home to Sunfish Fleet 120.

WLSGL hopes that the establishment of a regional circuit will help regatta organizers promote their events to the region. LYRA MISCONCEPTIONS, from Tom Lewin: "Several people have told me that they did NOT register for LYRA because they can't get that week off from work. Well you don't need a week off. The LYRA coarse racing will be on Saturday and Sunday for most boats (boats rating faster than 78 PHRF will race on Friday also). LYRA is really a grouping of 4 events that you can pick and choose what you want to participate in, some choose to race in the weekend course racing only; some add in the Freeman (night race) and others add in the delivery race. It's your choice, come for 1 event or all 3. The registration fee is very reasonable and it is based on the amount of events you want to do.

Commentary:

The 2010 Coolest Race On The Great Lakes Is Shaping Up To Be Another Great Challenge! For some the challenge will be making the start line due to the low water levels on Lake Ontario, for others the challenge will be the unpredictable weather we are experiencing

The Susan Hood Trophy Race is the first 2010 overnight yacht race of the year on Lake Ontario. It starts Friday June 4th from Port Credit Yacht Club in Mississauga, Ontario, Canada. While most people are getting ready for a nice bar-b-que or heading up to the cottage to enjoy the first Friday in June, over 300 sailors are preparing for a very different adventure. They will leave their jobs, pack their best and warmest wet weather clothing - and of course most importantly their safety gear to get ready for the 8pm start of the 73 mile overnight yacht race.

The Susan Hood Trophy Race is one of the most exciting and challenging races on the Great Lakes since this time of year tends to bring unpredictable weather. This year is no exception. In the past it has been referred to as the Coldest Race on the Lakes, but race organizers have dubbed it the "Coolest Race on the Lakes". Due to the cold water and warm weather patterns around the lake, storms can come in without much warning. With the wind chill factor coming across the extremely cold water, the feeling equates to being out on a damp winter night when there is seemingly never enough clothing to put on. Given the water temperature at this time of the year, attention to safety is a critical component of successfully completing the

race for more than the obvious reasons! The ultimate nightmare would be to have to rescue a crew member from the frigid waters of Lake Ontario.

The race begins outside Port Credit Yacht Club in Mississauga and heads west to the Burlington weather mark, just outside Hamilton Harbour. From there it heads south to the Niagara River mark. The final leg returns to Port Credit Yacht Club in Mississauga.

Offshore yacht races depend entirely on the wind to get around the racecourse, which is a great thing for the environment. If people are out relaxing on a nice mild evening there is a good chance these racers will be moving very slow. A typical yacht competing in this race will average a speed of 6 knots (7 mph) or 11km/hr, which means most yachts should return to Port Credit Yacht Club sometime Saturday morning - provided the winds hold up overnight. "Typically, the winds come up in the early evening and die in the morning leaving us out in the middle of the lake with no wind watching the sun come up." Said veteran racer, Ian McAllister; whose 34-foot yacht has competed in this race 14 times.

For some, the challenge will be making it out of the harbour to get to the start line. Dick Steigenga owns one of many boats that have not been able to launch in the water at Cathedral Bluffs Harbour in Scarborough. Due to the unusually low water levels this year, the channel leading out of the harbour is just over four feet deep and many sailboats require six to nine feet of clearance. "It's a problem that is worse this year than ever before", said Dick Steigenga, a sail maker based in Scarborough, who is looking at alternative means of getting their boats out of the harbour this year in order to make it to the start line. "It's been a tough job getting five boats out so far, but the boats that want to compete are putting in a lot of effort [to make it to the starting line]." said Steigenga.

The boats are gradually getting out of harbour one at a time by slow and arduous process of suspending 1,500 lbs in water barrels from the top of the masts to tip the boats on their sides. A crew of volunteer sailors is pitching in to help drag the boats through the mouth of the harbour.

If all goes well, Dick Steigenga's 44' yacht, Macintosh, will hopefully be dragged out of the harbour on the 24th of May. "A little rise in water level and some mild weather will make this a little easier task" said Steigenga, who has competed in most of the Susan Hood Race in the last 20 years.

Despite all the obstacles, race organizers at Port Credit Yacht Club are confident that this years numbers will increase over last year. Interest in offshore racing has continued to grow over the last few years and this race is now used as a warm-up for the Lake Ontario 300 race, which is a 300 nautical mile race that circumnavigates Lake Ontario. This is one of the most challenging races on the lakes and is the longest annual fresh water race in the world.

To obtain a User Fee Decal access for boats over 30 feet in length go to <https://dtops.cbp.dhs.gov/> This User Fee Decal is required for boats over 30 feet in length arriving in the United States from a port outside of the country. For more information regarding this requirement, refer to www.cbp.gov , click on travel and user fee decals and transponders.

U.S. CUSTOMS AND BORDER PROTECTION ANNOUNCES 2010 PLEASURE BOAT CLEARANCE PROCEDURES

BUFFALO, NY- U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) is announcing clearance procedures for pleasure boats arriving in the United States from Canada. The pleasure boat clearance procedures are part of CBP's comprehensive efforts to improve security at our nation's borders while facilitating legitimate travel.

Boaters, family members and all guests entering the United States must report for inspection immediately upon arrival. Arrival of a vessel is defined as the time when the vessel first comes to rest in U.S. waters, whether at anchor or at dock. CBP clearance may be obtained by one of the three following methods:

- Report for inspection at the nearest open marina Port of Entry (presently Thousand Islands and Lake Champlain areas only).
- Utilize a CBP videophone station located at: Dunkirk, Erie Basin Marina (Buffalo), North Tonawanda, Youngstown, Wilson, Olcott, Point Breeze, Rochester, Sodus Point, Oswego, Sackets Harbor, Clayton, Alexandria Bay, Morristown, Ogdensburg and Waddington. Please note: Videophones located in N.Y. State Parks have not been affected by any of the parks selected for closure.
- Be in possession of a pre-approved Form I-68 or NEXUS member proximity card and call 1-800-827-2851 to report your arrival.

Small boats travel document requirements:

- As required by the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI), U.S. and Canadian citizens must present a WHTI-compliant travel document for entry into the United States by land and sea. For complete WHTI information, please visit www.cbp.gov
- Boaters who have an I-68 form will need to follow the new travel document requirements. Ensuring that you have a WHTI-compliant document (U.S. Passport Card, Enhanced Driver's License/Enhanced Identification Card, I-551 card or Passport) will enable you to continue to utilize telephonic clearance procedures currently in place for I-68 holders.
- An I-68 form is not considered an identity document or a travel document.

To help facilitate your inspection, pleasure boaters should have the below-listed information available at the time of inspection:

- Name, Date of Birth and Citizenship of all persons on board
- Name of the boat and/or Boat Registration Number
- U.S. Decal Number (if 30 feet or longer)
- Home Port and Current Location

Pleasure boaters and frequent cross-border travelers are encouraged to participate in the NEXUS alternative inspection program. NEXUS members will enjoy a simplified entry process while traveling across the United States-Canada border by motor vehicle or pleasure boat. Application forms are available on the Canadian Border Services Agency (CBSA) website at www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca. For NEXUS toll free information, (U.S. and Canadian), call 1-866-NEXUS 26 (1-866-639-8726).

Failure to report can result in civil penalties and fines up to \$10,000 as defined in Title 19, U.S. Code, Section 1436.

For other U.S. reporting information, call 1-800-827-2851 or visit www.cbp.gov. To report suspicious activity, boaters are encouraged to call 1-800-331-0353 for Lake Erie, Lake Ontario and Niagara River, or 1-800-247-2434 for the St Lawrence River and Lake Champlain.
