Commentary:

Small but Good: Modern society seems to be obsessed with things large and grand. We celebrate the biggest, fastest, tallest, strongest, most expensive, and so forth. But sometimes good things come in small packages too. The large yacht clubs get plenty of attention, and deservedly so, because they have the means, facilities and personnel to host major events. Their place in sailing is important and assured, and in many cases they are the guardians of the yachting tradition. However, for every one of the large clubs there are a number of smaller ones with memberships just as dedicated and enthusiastic, mostly run by tireless volunteers. These clubs don't get the same billing in the yachting press, but they are an indispensable connection to the sport for the average sailor.

Some clubs don't even have clubhouses or a physical plant of any sort, they exist as "paper" entities. One prime example in our area is the Buffalo Harbor Sailing Club, an organization that has prospered for over 30 years providing an extensive sailing program for minimal dues. It is all about the people.

There are many examples of small clubs in harbors that do not have the population to support large fleets, yet their sailors are just as keen as the rest of us. Instead of bellying up to a mahogany bar after the race they might gather at a picnic table, but the war stories are the same.

The same thing applies to the types of boats we sail. Some classes are well known and grab the headlines. If the boat has the name Melges or Farr attached to it, for example, chances are you will see the results well publicized. But there are many more sailors whose "yacht" is a 30 year old PHRF warrior, maybe not even designed as a true racer, but to that owner and crew it is the warhorse they can't wait to go to battle on every Wednesday night.

So let's not get all wrapped up in the bigger is better thing, enjoy what we have, and respect our fellow sailors regardless of where they are from or what they sail. Excellent sailors are all around us, in boats of all descriptions, and in places large and small.

US Customs & Border Protection (CBP) Info:

To obtain a User Fee Decal access for boats over 30 feet in length go to <https://dtops.cbp.dhs.gov/> This User Fee Decal is required for boats over 30 feet in length arriving in the United States from a port outside of the country. For more information regarding this requirement, refer to www.cbp.gov , click on travel and user fee decals and transponders.

U.S. CUSTOMS AND BORDER PROTECTION ANNOUNCES 2010 PLEASURE BOAT CLEARANCE PROCEDURES

BUFFALO, NY- U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) is announcing clearance procedures for pleasure boats arriving in the United States from Canada. The pleasure boat clearance procedures are part of CBP's comprehensive efforts to improve security at our nation's borders while facilitating legitimate travel.

Boaters, family members and all guests entering the United States must report for inspection immediately upon arrival. Arrival of a vessel is defined as the time when the vessel first comes to rest in U.S. waters, whether at anchor or at dock. CBP clearance may be obtained by one of the three following methods:

- Report for inspection at the nearest open marina Port of Entry (presently Thousand Islands and Lake Champlain areas only).
- Utilize a CBP videophone station located at: Dunkirk, Erie Basin Marina (Buffalo), North Tonawanda, Youngstown, Wilson, Olcott, Point Breeze, Rochester, Sodus Point, Oswego, Sackets Harbor, Clayton, Alexandria Bay, Morristown, Ogdensburg and Waddington. Please note: Videophones located in N.Y. State Parks have not been affected by any of the parks selected for closure.
- Be in possession of a pre-approved Form I-68 or NEXUS member proximity card and call 1-800-827-2851 to report your arrival.

Small boats travel document requirements:

- As required by the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative (WHTI), U.S. and Canadian citizens must present a WHTI-compliant travel document for entry into the United States by land and sea. For complete WHTI information, please visit www.cbp.gov
- Boaters who have an I-68 form will need to follow the new travel document requirements. Ensuring that you have a WHTI-compliant document (U.S. Passport Card, Enhanced Driver's License/Enhanced Identification Card, I-551 card or Passport) will enable you to continue to utilize telephonic clearance procedures currently in place for I-68 holders.
- An I-68 form is not considered an identity document or a travel document.

To help facilitate your inspection, pleasure boaters should have the below-listed information available at the time of inspection:

- Name, Date of Birth and Citizenship of all persons on board
- Name of the boat and/or Boat Registration Number
- U.S. Decal Number (if 30 feet or longer)
- Home Port and Current Location

Pleasure boaters and frequent cross-border travelers are encouraged to participate in the NEXUS alternative inspection program. NEXUS members will enjoy a simplified entry process while traveling across the United States-Canada border by motor vehicle or pleasure boat. Application forms are available on the Canadian Border Services Agency (CBSA) website at www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca. For NEXUS toll free information, (U.S. and Canadian), call 1-866-NEXUS 26 (1-866-639-8726).

Failure to report can result in civil penalties and fines up to \$10,000 as defined in Title 19, U.S. Code, Section 1436.

For other U.S. reporting information, call 1-800-827-2851 or visit www.cbp.gov. To report suspicious activity, boaters are encouraged to call 1-800-331-0353 for Lake Erie, Lake Ontario and Niagara River, or 1-800-247-2434 for the St Lawrence River and Lake Champlain.
