What's New? By Don Finkle: As a regatta organizer and volunteer I know I speak for the others who have to deal with a growing problem, that being the tendency of racers to wait until the last minute to register. It is very difficult to set up your fleets, circles, starting orders, etc. when you don't know who is coming until the last minute. Obviously this causes havoc with those who have to plan meals, order T shirts, etc. One answer is to cut off registrations early, but we would really like to avoid shutting anyone out. The answer is simple, sign up early, but if you haven't, please do so now!

Last weekend we made a quick trip to Rhode Island to see family and friends, especially our friends Hank and Ann who are living aboard their 42 foot trawler. We timed the visit to when they would be passing through on their way to Maine. It was great to see them, if even for a short time, and to see how relaxed they are with the live-aboard lifestyle. They have traveled over 7,000 miles in the last year and a half since movign aboard. Former sailors and racers, they are thoroughly enjoying themselves.

On the way home we stopped to see the first J/111 in production. As often happens with the first hull of any new model, they are a few weeks behind schedule, but what we saw looks very nice. The keel and rudder were both available for inspection, and each looked to be of very high quality. The keel is a stainless steel fin with a lead bulb. The keel also has lead in the lower section of the fin, with a hollow upper section. The rudder was very fair and has a carbon stock, beautiful work. Can't wait to see the finished product!

The new Beneteau First 30 will be making her debut in the US in late August, with formal intro at the Annapolis show in October. We recently got some detail shots of the boat that will be posted to our website www.rcryachts.com shortly.

The Lake Ontario 300 has been growing like crazy in recent years, with a record turnout

again for the start this weekend. This event offers short-handed and fully crewed fleets, with and without spinnakers, so there is a place for all. Good luck to all, and here is hoping for some good weather. Given the time it takes to complete this long distance race, the fleet is almost sure to encounter a variety of conditions.

The Youngstown Level Regatta registrations have been coming in fast and furious of late, we now have 123 boats signed up, 20 in the last day alone. We are expecting about 175. With five race courses the fleets will be spread out enough to provide good racing, and we have some excellent race officers lined up. How about this for our PRO line-up: Hank Stuart, Wayne Bretsch, Richard Hinterhoeller, John Tracy and John Weakley. Thanks to RYC, NOLSC, PCYC, NYC and RCYC for providing boats and/or RC staff too. If you have ever been here before I don't have to tell you about the social activities and shore-side camaraderie. You need to be in Youngstown the weekend of July 24-25, fun city!

The week following Level the LYRA will be hosted by Buffalo YC, only the second time in the 126 year history of LYRA that the event will be on Lake Erie. This another don't-miss event, especially for any boat on Lake Erie. The deadline for early entry is July 15, after that there is a late fee.

Commentary:

MAKING OR BREAKING A JUNIOR SAILOR, By Bill Sandberg, WindCheck magazine (sent by Adam

Burns): Why is it that many junior sailing programs lose as many as half their kids by the third year? There are many reasons, but the bulk of them lie with the two groups who have the greatest influence on young sailors - instructors and parents.

Instructor Don'ts

- 1) Don't play favorites. It's easy to spend time with the sailor who wins all the regattas, but it can be far more rewarding to watch a young sailor come out of his or her shell and develop a real love for the sport.
- 2) Don't forget that as a role model, the kids will look up to you. If you smoke or show up hung-over, they will think that is cool.
- 3) Don't overcoach. At most Opti regattas, the kids do not need to be told the mistakes they just made on the racecourse. They need a water bottle and a hug.
- 4) Don't forget that this is not school. It's meant to be fun. OK, now that I've beaten up on the instructors, let's move to potentially the worst problem - overzealous parents.

Parent Don'ts

- 1) Don't help your child rig or unrig their boat. This is something they need to learn themselves, and they're probably embarrassed by your "help."
- 2) Don't berate an instructor, especially in front of the sailors. This immediately undermines their authority and thus their ability to do their job. If you have a problem, seek out the program chair or a member of the committee. It will be far more effective.
- 3) Don't go to regattas and scream and cheer when your child or your program's child rounds a mark in a high position. How do you think this makes the kids at the end of the fleet feel? Like losers.
- 4) Don't make the first question you ask your child after a regatta, "How'd you finish?" It should be, "Did you have fun?" There are some exceptions to this. If they are older and committed to (racing), it's OK to ask how they did. These are committed racers, and winning is fun. However, don't grill them for information. It will come out. Discuss, don't preach.

I fully realize that the vast majority of instructors and parents are very effective in raising kids to have a lifelong love of the water, but it's that minority that can ruin a summer for all. As I've said ad nauseum, if it isn't fun, then we are not helping to grow our sport.

A Little Something to Think About When You Are Out On The Water!! (from the Buffalo Harbor SC Newsletter): "The new captain jumped from the cockpit, fully dressed, and sprinted through the water. A former lifeguard, he kept his eyes on his victim as he headed straight for the owners who were swimming between their anchored sportfisher and the beach. "I think he thinks you're drowning," the husband said to his wife. They had been splashing each other and she had screamed but now they were just standing, neck-deep on the sand bar. "We're fine, what is he doing?" she asked, a little annoyed. "We're fine!" the husband yelled, waving him off, but his captain kept swimming hard. "Move!" he barked as he sprinted between the stunned owners. Directly behind them, not ten feet away, their nine-year-old daughter was

drowning. Safely above the surface in the arms of the captain, she burst into tears, "Daddy!"

How did this captain know, from fifty feet away, what the father couldn't recognize from just ten? Drowning is not the violent, splashing, call for help that most people expect. The captain was trained to recognize drowning by experts and years of experience. The father, on the other hand, had learned what drowning looks like by watching television. If you spend time on or near the water (hint: that's all of us) then you should make sure that you and your crew knows what to look for whenever people enter the water. Until she cried a tearful, "Daddy," she hadn't made a sound.

As a former Coast Guard rescue swimmer, I wasn't surprised at all by this story. Drowning is almost always a deceptively quiet event. The waving, splashing, and yelling that dramatic conditioning (television) prepares us to look for, is rarely seen in real life.

The Instinctive Drowning Response - so named by Francesco A. Pia, Ph.D., is what people do to avoid actual or perceived suffocation in the water. And it does not look like most people expect. There is very little splashing, no waving, and no yelling or calls for help of any kind. To get an idea of just how quiet and undramatic from the surface drowning can be, consider this: It is the number two cause of accidental death in children, age 15 and under (just behind vehicle accidents) - of the approximately 750 children who will drown next year, about 375 of them will do so within 25 yards of a parent or other adult. In ten percent of those drownings, the adult will actually watch them do it, having no idea it is happening (source: CDC).

Drowning does not look like drowning - Dr. Pia, in an article in the Coast Guard's On Scene Magazine, described the instinctive drowning response like this:

1. Except in rare circumstances, drowning people are physiologically unable to call out for help. The respiratory system was designed for breathing. Speech is the secondary or overlaid function. Breathing must be fulfilled, before speech occurs.
2. Drowning people's mouths alternately sink below and reappear above the surface of the water. The mouths of drowning people are not above the surface of the water long enough for them to exhale, inhale, and call out for help. When the drowning people's mouths are above the surface, they exhale and inhale quickly as their mouths start to sink below the surface of the water.
3. Drowning people cannot wave for help. Nature instinctively forces them to extend their arms laterally and press down on the water's surface. Pressing down on the surface of the water, permits drowning people to leverage their bodies so they can lift their mouths out of the water to breathe.
4. Throughout the Instinctive Drowning Response, drowning people cannot voluntarily control their arm movements. Physiologically, drowning people who are struggling on the surface of the water cannot stop drowning and perform voluntary movements such as waving for help, moving toward a rescuer, or reaching out for a piece of rescue equipment.
5. From beginning to end of the Instinctive Drowning Response people's bodies remain upright in the water, with no evidence of a supporting kick. Unless rescued by a trained lifeguard, these drowning people can only struggle on the surface of the water from 20 to 60 seconds before submersion occurs.
