What's New? By Don Finkle: We are really busy here with preparation for the 37th Annual Youngstown Level Regatta that takes place this weekend. The action starts with a street party on Thursday night, with Main Street blocked off from vehicle traffic for a fun and mellow evening of food, drink, music, regatta clothing sales, and socializing. If you are in the area it is a good and inexpensive time. Friday most of the fleet arrives and the shore side social action at the waterfront takes off. Friday we also hold our Beneteau sailors' party at RCR's Youngstown showroom from 5:30-8 PM. Racing is held on Saturday and Sunday. Registration is open through Friday night, but we really ask you not to wait that long. I'd really like to get some sleep before racing on Saturday!

The Lake Ontario 300 Report (from the LO 300 website): "The 2010 version of the LO300 was an amazing success. Over 180 boats had a great spinnaker start on Saturday morning in increasing winds. The boats and crew endured a fierce storm on Saturday afternoon and hellish doldrums on Sunday but by Tuesday afternoon all were safe in harbour. Over 60 boats retired for reasons various reasons - mostly sail damage - but no one was seriously injured. The festivities ended with a great party where the skippers, crew, and volunteers shared food, drinks, and stories. See you next year!" (we are looking for results but could not find them as of this date, we should have them for next week)

More on the LO 300, from Scuttlebutt: "Only hours after the start on Saturday, July 17th of the Lake Ontario 300 from Port Credit, ONT, the skies darkened and a squall hit the 198 entrants for the Lake Ontario 300. Reported gusts of over 40 knots were accompanied by heavy rain and hail, leading to a very challenging 6 to 8 hours of very unstable weather, followed by total absence of breeze along the south shore half-way through the race. Fifty-three boats are recorded as having dropped out of the race, with the balance of the fleet finishing Monday and Tuesday. No results are yet posted. -- Event website: <http://www.lo300.org/>"

Commentary:

About Regatta Registration, from Chris Doyle: "Don: I know you love having some outside views for your weekly newsletter. So, in response to your oft-stated complaint that people ought not wait until the last minute to register for regattas, I offer the following true story:

I am a frequent competitor at the Annapolis NOOD, and intended to attend this year as well. I rounded up crew (Will and Nick), arranged for a place to stay (with my friends the McChesneys) and registered for the regatta before the early registration deadline passed. When I registered, I paid extra for two social tickets so my crew would be well fed and watered during this three-day event.

Shortly after I paid my \$381, I discovered that a late-developing business commitment was going to prevent me from attending (New York Tax Department, I curse you!). I offered the boat to the crew, but they decided they'd rather not go if I was not going to be there too. So I e-mailed the NOOD Office and told them I could not attend and asked for my money back. This was more than a week before the regatta.

I did not get a response, but a month and a half later I did get two Mount Gay hats (which is good since after the last one blew off of my head I am down to less than 90 of the omnipresent red hood ornaments) and a knapsack from North Sails filled with sponsor advertisements. For \$381! Such a deal!

People have less control over their schedules now than ever before, so it should be expected that folks are going to hesitate to make a commitment for something that ought to be lower on their list of priorities than maintaining family harmony or keeping their jobs. That said, I'd be willing to register for the 2011 Level Regatta the day the website goes live if a reasonable refund policy is included in the Notice of Race."

My reply: Chris, thank you very much for writing. We can understand your frustration, and it is experiences such as yours that can discourage sailors from signing up in advance. However, if everyone waited to register until near the start of the event the organizers would never be able to plan appropriately, and the sailors would suffer in the long run. Encouraging early sign-up while still allowing refunds for a legitimate reason seems to be the fairest way to manage the system.

For the record the YYC Level has a refund policy so that anyone who is unable to attend can request their entry fee back. Many regattas now allow registration without up-front payment. Those who use the www.yachtscoring.com system, such as we do for Level, can sign up without advance payment, so long as they pay by the cut-off date. There is some risk to the event host that not everyone who registers will show up, but the benefits outweigh this risk. The vast majority of those who register end up attending anyway. Simply registering is an act of commitment on the part of the owner, and he/she is more likely to make the

event as a result. When other sailors see fleets developing by watching the event entry list, it encourages turn-out. As someone who has to plan all the racing logistics I can assure you that being able to see which boats are coming makes it much easier to set up the race courses, fleet break-outs, starting order, etc. Not knowing until the eve of the event would be a nightmare.

While there is a risk on the part of the owner who registers in advance (unless there is a refund policy), there is a far greater risk facing the event organizing authority. The cost to bring in tents, portable toilets, bands, trophies, food, beverages, staff, etc., etc. is considerable. Any help the racers can give the host by signing up in a timely fashion is desirable, and I would go so far as to say that the sailors owe it to those who run these events to do so.

THE EVOLUTION OF YOUTH RACERS (from Scuttlebutt) By Amy Gross-Kehoe, US SAILING Youth Council Chair: "If youth racing is on the rise, why are young adults falling off? Youth Racing seems to be steadily growing since the mid 90's with more and more kids (and their families) traveling greater distances to compete at higher-level events. The opportunities are set into each class' annual schedule; regattas carry reputations for being well-run and competitive.

Whether you're sailing Sabots, Optimis, Laser, Radial, 29er or 420... juniors have to hit at least some of the big events to continue to grow and succeed. It's keepin' up with the Jones' kid.

Enter High School and then College sailing, where fleets of boats are provided. Entry cost is a lifejacket and dry suit (that you may already own from junior sailing). No new sails to buy, no losing pricey spin poles. Most schools even pay for your gas these days. Lots of new sailors getting pulled in too... my High School team is 30% new sailors, and I imagine most college teams are similar. It's easy, and you can get spoiled traveling around the country, competing in close, competitive racing!

When you get out of college and get that first job, it's tough... do I want to buy my own boat or actually have enough money to buy shirts that don't have a regatta name on them and take a girl on a date? Where am I going to live? Do I want to get a V15, Sonar or a J/22? Maybe I can get hooked up with that Farr 40 Team? I hear Key West Race Week is fun... Maybe I'm a past All-American and people are going to ask me what Olympic class I'm moving into... let's see, a year of campaigning costs \$60k. Ugh! And I only get 2 weeks vacation per year... If I quit my job, I lose health insurance... Maybe it's time to get that MBA, then if I can find a job, I can afford a boat that I won't have any time to sail...

Clubs who have fleets of easy-sail-and-maintain boats are keeping our young adults sailing until they become established enough to get boats of their own. New York YC's Sonars, Fort Worth Boat Club's J/22's, Clubs with V15's and more! Challenge another club to put together a team of Under 30's to Team Race! Throw a great dinner and free cocktail hour! Start running weeknight racing and team race/match race events to get the young adults down to your club! Maybe they'll join!
