What's New? By Don Finkle: If you weren't in

Youngstown last weekend you missed some great racing and a ton of fun (taking nothing away from those who went to Sail Oswego). The 37th Annual Youngstown Level Regatta was held in mostly fine weather conditions, with good breeze that only shut off later each day. The race officers and their committees did a superb job, as evidenced by the numerous kudos we received from competitors. A heartfelt thanks to all the RC members, and especially to PROs Wayne Bretsch, Hank Stuart, John Tracy, Richard Hinterhoeller and John Weakley (Courses A-E respectively). I am very proud of my home club Youngstown YC and the effort put forth by so many volunteers to produce a wonderful event yet again.

Coming off the high of the Level, it is very disappointing to see that more boats have not registered for the LYRA in Buffalo. I really missed the boat here, I truly expected that many more Lake Erie boats would take advantage of this rare opportunity. If you have a racing boat on the east end of Lake Erie and you are not doing LYRA you are losing out on some great racing and shoreside activities. This is especially hard to understand because there are so few major big-boat regattas held in this region, so it's not like the calendar is jammed like it is on Lake Ontario. Oh well, I look forward to seeing those of you who will be there this weekend, I am really looking forward to the event.

On the positive side the Beneteau 36.7 Great Lakes Championship to be held in conjunction with LYRA has a fine fleet of 18 yachts signed up, the Farr 30's are hosting their GLC there as well, and IRC racing comes to Buffalo for the first time. The LYRA Freeman Cup overnight race will be held tonight, and the course racing starts Friday for the larger boats, with the others racing only Sat-Sun. Yesterday the LYRA Centennial Race was held, the course being Port Colbourne to Buffalo. It was a downwind slide the whole way in 7-8 knots of air. Results may be found below.

One of the highlights of the LYRA weekend will be Gary Jobson's celebrity Tech Dinghy

match racing series to be held right in front of BYC. 12 skippers have been selected to take part, with all proceeds going to the Leukemia Society.

In the next few weeks we will be seeing the debut of three new race boats that we've been anxiously awaiting. The new 36 foot J/111 will be launched in RI next week. The initial Beneteau First 35 to hit North America will land in Annapolis in a few days, and by mid-August the Beneteau First 30 will also come into 'Naptown. New boats are always cause for some excitement, and since the recession has slowed the introduction of new models for everyone, having three come so close together is a real bonus. Obviously we'll have much to report in the coming weeks.

Commentary:

A New Boat Story, by Don Finkle: Several years ago I was at the Annapolis Boatshow and ran across a really cool new boat, the 36 foot Farr 11S day racer. It did not occur to me at the time that it would be something we would sell, but the significant number of new design features all in one boat impressed me. I wrote about it in this newsletter and one of our long time customers, Dick Aubrecht of Buffalo, became intrigued by the technology incorporated in the boat. Dick's background is in design engineering for the aerospace industry so this seemed to him to be an interesting challenge. Before long RCR and Farr Yacht Sales collaborated on an order for a new 11S to be custom built for Dick.

Just what is a Farr 11S? Dick's version has the following features: flush deck, huge long open cockpit, canting carbon fiber keel with lead bulb, twin retractable carbon daggerboards ("Canards"), inboard diesel with retractable shaft and prop, full carbon construction, carbon fractional rig by Hall, retracting carbon bowsprit for masthead kites, square top mainsail, twin rudders linked to a centerline tiller, etc. Interior? Not much! Headroom? Who needs headroom! The boat is just a high-tech toy that incorporates a lot of the latest technology and that is what appealed most to Dick, the chance to play with, tweak and learn something so new and different.

The boat was built in Dubai by Premier Composites. Despite my 38 years in this business, during which we have been involved in many new boat projects, some built overseas, this one was surely more involved than any other. As it turned out I underestimated the complexity of the process, especially given the time zone difference and difficulty in getting immediate responses to questions. When it is impractical to see the boat being built you end up relying on others, and when communication is sporadic it makes it even more difficult. Suffice to say that the build process took longer than expected, one reason being that the design changed from the first boat to Dick's hull number 5. Each boat is somewhat different from the others, and as prior boats were sailed improvements were made.

Once the boat got here in Buffalo the real fun started. The boat was more a kit than a finished product. Here is where I have to take my hat off to Dick and his friends. There were many loose ends, not unusual for a custom project like this, especially one with so many non-standard features. Instead of getting upset, as each obstacle was encountered Dick would apply his background in engineering problem-solving and just work through it. Our RCR Buffalo staff would get involved where appropriate, but frankly some of what needed to happen was way too technical for the boatyard to deal with. In the end the commissioning was a collaborative effort of Dick and his crew, Bill O'Malley from Farr YS, RCR's staff, and finally a guy that Premier sent over from Dubai to do some rework. I can't say enough for Dick's understanding and positive attitude throughout the process. But in his eyes it has all been worth it. Last week, after his most recent sail in the boat, he described the performance as "150% of expectations". Not bad!

Here is his letter to us the other day, which he encouraged us to print here:

"Don, Our Farr 11S is finally mostly commissioned. I am writing to say thank you to yourself, the entire RCR Buffalo staff, Max Waimer at Premier Composites, Bill O'Malley of Farr Yachts, David Moffet at Hallspars and Hugh Beaton at North Sails for everyone's help in this project. There have been numerous challenges and issues. Everyone has been very responsive and creative in sorting up everything from shipping delays by the U.S. Customs Inspectors to many details.

My boat is Hull number 5, but in reality is Hull number 2 of the redesign. Ours is really the first build of new design. As such, as we have experienced, there are many more issues to manage than with a production boat.

We have sailed the boat five times. Everyone who has sailed with us is very impressed with the boat's performance. In short, it just goes fast and has a great feel. We are on a very steep learning curve to handle the keel, canting dagger boards, the fat head main, the large assymetric chute, etc. There are a lot more moving parts than with any previous boats. Getting any of these out of order can have serious consequences.

We are having great fun learning to handle the potential in this boat. Although we are about six weeks behind where I had planned to be this summer, we still hope to be on the starting line for a couple of races yet this year.

Over the past 36 years, I have bought five boats through RCR. The guidance and support you fellows have provided has always been first rate.

IRC Update:

(from Kevin Brown on behalf of the executive of the International IRC Owners Association, Lake Ontario Fleet) It has been a busy month for our IRC fleet with two very successful and well attended events.

The first was our 2010 IRC Canadian Championship hosted by the Port Credit Yacht Club in conjunction with their annual open regatta. Our inaugural event last year at Etobicoke Yacht Club set a high standard to follow and even though on the water we all would have appreciated more racing, the host club did an exceptional job. We went from a substantial fleet of 25 boats in 2009 to an exceptional 40 boat fleet this year. The standard of sailing and boat preparation was outstanding throughout our three IRC divisions this year. Many boats were new to our IRC fleet and the diversity and competence of these new boats was outstanding. We are definitely setting the standard for racing on Lake Ontario and we just continue to attract top notch competition. The IRC rule has allowed for an incredibly diverse fleet to be extremely competitive, but as in any competitive fleet, the racing quality is very high at the top and it takes a great team on a well

prepared boat to find the top in any of our divisions. Those that won or placed well should be very proud of their accomplishment.

There were so many notable boats at the IRC Canadians that we certainly can not mention them all but we would be remiss if we did not note just a few of our competitors. Our growing IRC 3 fleet was led by the evergreen Red Jacket, with an outstanding performance put in by Andrew Reim's J27 Curved Air in its very first IRC event. Winston Beckett's Santana 30/30 was well sailed as usual and Richard Huczek's J92 and Michael Flynn's Star 30 both had one of their best regattas to date. In the overall IRC Canadian Championship results, seven of the top ten boats hailed from IRC 3 and our new IRC Canadian champion is Peter Milligan's IRC 3 winning Red Jacket. The largest boat in the division was first and the smallest came second. An interesting statistic. Very well done.

Our IRC 2 fleet has developed into an incredibly competitive mix of old and new, all with equal opportunity to be on top. The J35's of Stephen Trevitt and Mike Lucas both sailed strong events with newcomer Joseph Pawlowski bringing his new Beneteau 10R from Youngstown to put in a solid performance to take third place. Also new to our IRC 2 fleet this weekend was Leszek Siek's J35 and Jamie MacCorkindale's Killing 40. Both are welcome additions to this fleet and hopefully regular participants in the future. This fleet is getting better with every event with new, competitive boats joining the fray.

In IRC 1, the racing was as tight as ever with Notorious finishing first and the newly modified and very well sailed Umi Taka making a strong showing and John McLeod's Hot Water putting in a solid performance as they have done many times in recent years. It was great to see Bruce Pierce's Rampage II well in the mix and the MacDonald family on Gaucho served notice that they will be a force in IRC. Rags and Black Prince were in the hunt all weekend and we want to welcome both Masquarade and Busted Flush to our strong IRC 1 fleet. Busted Flush has come all the way from Ottawa to get a taste of some really competitive fleet racing. This sixteen boat division contained strong competition from top to bottom. Our 'big boat' fleet has truly revived racing on Lake Ontario and we expect to see many more boats from around the Lake join our fleet in the future. The best boats on the lake are sailing here and we can safely state we are undeniably the place to play for any competitive program in the region.

Last weekend we had two competitive IRC divisions in the 2010 Lake Ontario 300 event hosted by Port Credit Yacht Club. There was a ten boat IRC 1 fleet and seven boats in the IRC 2 fleet. This was a decent turnout for IRC in this type of competition, which tends to attract the more casual PHRF-type club racer, more than IRC racers who usually prefer the close quarters of short course racing. We have been promoting this event to our IRC fleet as an opportunity to do a Mac-style event without leaving Lake Ontario. Maybe we are a little biased, but we believe we had by far, the best boats and the best sailors on the course in our IRC divisions. One statistic really supports this statement. It was a tough race in spots and the fleet drop out rate was about one in three. Between our two IRC divisions we had only one withdrawal. I think that is a statistic which we all can take pride in. We all had stories of broken sails and gear but all persevered to finish and showed the competency and ability that makes our sailors a cut above.

The only boat new to our IRC fleet for the L0300 was the C&C 115 Happy Puppy. They hail from Kingston but we expect to see more of them now that they have had a taste of sailing in our very competitive IRC 1 fleet, which for this event, contained a number of other well sailed 115's such as Beyond Survival, Timorian and Sula Sula. Also of note in this race was a very strong group of J109's that included Blue Streak which took third in class, Phoenix, Carpe Ventus and Lively who all participated in a very competitive battle within IRC 2. Congratulations to Red Jacket and the Archambault 35 for their one, two finish in IRC 2.

In IRC 1 we had a truly spectacular ride in Notorious with sustained speeds in the 20 knot range for good portions of the leg from Toronto to Main Duck. I have to say my crew did a truly outstanding job. Gaucho and Notorious shared some incredible racing at the front of the fleet. Both crews were keeping the 'pedal to the metal' for the entire race. Not far behind us there was an extremely tight battle going on between the

Beneteau 40.7 Mullet, which made the trek from Rochester to join us in IRC 1 for this race, and Chris Rypkema's 40.7 Umi Taka. The final margin of victory for Umi Taka over Mullet was a minuscule four minutes after over two days on the water. That's close racing. Congratulations to everyone who participated in our two IRC divisions. It was a job well done and a fine example of good preparation, seamanship and perseverance. On a final note we want to note the third place performance of our IRC regulars Frank and Judy Button who sailed their C&C 115 to a third overall in the double handed spinnaker division. Well done you two.
