## **Commentary:**

**Regatta Reflections, by Don Finkle:** I've collected some mental notes after the last couple of weeks of regattas. Before getting into the meaty stuff I'd like to pass along some comments that were actually given to me by competitors in my capacity as a race chairman. It is always nice to get feedback, especially when it can be shared with others. These racers were frustrated by other yachts who either 1) would not stay clear of the starting area when other fleets were starting, or 2) would not clear the finish area so yachts behind could finish cleanly, or 3) Interfered with another course on their way to or from their own racing area. We've written here in the past about all these things, but they bear repeating.

Now on to our own experiences, included here for purposes of illustration. On Saturday at the LYRA we had what can best be described as a challenging day. When we were back at the basin after racing one of the crew looked at me and said "How can you be so relaxed, I'd be suicidal right now" . I guess as one grows older it all falls into perspective. It is not life or death, just a boat race. Sometimes when it rains it pours, and as long as nobody gets hurt you put it behind you and go out the next day and try to do better.

There were three races on Saturday at the LYRA. The day before we had performed below our expectations, in part because I had been OCS in two races and had to start last. That reminds me of the old saying, "You can't win the regatta on the first day, but you can lose it". Race one on Day Two began with a good start at the pin end and we were looking pretty good for awhile. We then decided not to hang out to the corner and tacked back to cross as many of the boats that went up the middle as we could. As we approached the first starboard tack we got headed a bit, he got lifted, and then a safe cross looked like it was going to be close. Here is where the first mistake of the day came in. When we tacked we figured we'd cross easily, and so our mind set was that we would in fact cross. As we closed it looked like we still would, but then it became less and less certain. We are sailing a Beneteau 36.7, and we don't spin like a dinghy.

As we got closer we could not see anyone on the starboard tack boat, they were all on the weather rail behind the sails, so nobody was looking at us. We should have yelled "tack or cross", to let them know we were there and also so that we might pass one another without incident, but we did not say anything. I doubt they would have wanted us to lee-bow them. But some indecision on our part resulted in us getting too close by the time that I decided we would not in fact safely cross. At that point we had the choice of trying to duck, but a late duck in a boat this size runs the risk of a T-bone, so the safer thing is to tack. We tacked but it was too close, we fouled (no collision) and did our 720 turns. So what was looking like a good start to the day's racing went south in a hurry.

The things we did wrong above: we failed to communicate with the other boat and we waited too long to make our move. What we did right was not risk the cross or try a late duck. Also, if you think you may collide with another boat you want to do it rail-to-rail, not a T-bone.

The second race of the day started with a general recall. During the start sequence another boat got pushed past head to wind below us and came back through the line on Port tack, colliding with us as we were on the line on Starboard (I could not see them through the headsail). Fortunately the collision was rail-to-rail and the damage was not serious, both boats were able to continue racing that day. The other skipper was very apologetic and once we established that nobody was hurt and that the damage would not effect our ability to continue we put it behind us. But that was two unfortunate incidents in 2 races.

The third race would be our best of the day. We were up with the front part of the fleet, our speed seemed good and we were going the right way. Then we had our final problem of the day. Going into the leeward mark we were inside and felt we had room on the outside boat. We failed to hail for room because it seemed to us that it was obvious we had mark-room. They did not hail that we didn't have room, because they either felt it was obvious we did not, or that we hadn't hailed for it. In any case neither boat said anything to the other. I was about to round the mark which required a jibe for us, when the other boat turned up sharply to round and I thought I might T-bone them. So I tried to turn to avoid but clipped their stern rail.

The damage was not serious but there had been a collision, so somebody was wrong. We felt we had room and so did not want to do a 720 if we were in the right. We were in the unenviable position of being a boat out of contention protesting the boat that was leading the regatta. It was not a fun place to be, I hate to be involved in protests, but we felt that we had to go through with it in the spirit of the rules. I told the crew I did not mind losing the protest under the circumstances because we did not want to be the spoiler, but we were anxious to hear what the Jury decided for our own better understanding in the future.

As it turned out we were DSQ'd, and while we lost our best finish of the regatta we had not upset the standings in the event. The representative of the other yacht admitted after the hearing that there should have been some communication between the two boats as we approached the mark, and if that had occurred there would have been no incident. So once again communication is often the key to staying out of trouble.

So that wrapped up our challenging day. Fortunately the party was good afterward, and we all came away

being a bit wiser for the experiences.
