**RFA Flashes for December 6, by Jimmy Barnash:** "The forecast on Sunday proved more threatening than the weather actually was. A SSW breeze greeted sailors to the tune of 12-17 Kts (?) which eventually decreased to about 5 kts from the same direction. The RC set up on the O-Lees pier with a windward mark near the ferry terminal and a leeward mark just north of the start / finish line. The first race was twice around using the start/ finish pin as the leeward mark. During the second run a crashboat set a leeward gate as 15-20 boats were expected- far too many for only one leeward mark. Ralph Simpson must of forgot about the course configuration as he bypassed the finish line headed towards the gate. We reminded Ralph of the course and he probably lost a few spots in the process- but it was entertaining anyway. A few more races were held with the wind in the mid teens and a right shift (SW) seemed to skew the course. This right shift made starboard the favored upwind tack and port the long leeward tack, most seemed to gybe around the offset with a parade downhill. That being said, a clean start enabling one to continue for a minute or so seemed to translate into a good finish. I expected the wind to continue shifting right but to my surprise the breeze shifted left to about due south and started to decrease, guess that's why I'm not a meteorologist.

Somewhere around race 4 or 5 the wind crept back to SSW with about 10 kts. These races had relatively square legs. People had success starting at both ends, the key seemed to be clear air just after the start. With the wind back at SSW gybing around the offset didn't work well, as the ferry buildings blocked the wind

too much. A bare - away rounding for the first 20-30% of the leg looked best.

At about race 6 or 7 the wind continued to shift left to about SSE, and drop to ~7 kts. This left shift somehow translated into sailors blindingly banging the left corner upwind, often sailing near the launching ramp. Getting out of corner proved deadly, as the RYC clubhouse casts quite a large windshadow. Remember- in light winds pressure is king. The final race or two had the wind returning to SSW at about 5-8 kts. Not too much to say here other than starts and clean air was critical.

Throughout the day Mike sailed smarter than the fleet, as he was nearly flawless. If he wasn't leading a race, he eventually ground the leader down and poked ahead. Mike's head was out of the boat more than any other sailor. This means when sailing upwind looking forward for wind more than at your boat/sail provides the biggest gains. Thus when sailing downwind, look behind you for pressure- unless your out of control. If that's the case, trim the vang, head up and hold on!

Thanks to the RC support of Delia Ingham, Lambo and Joy for braving the cold temps. Joining me on Crashboat was Paul Owen, Jenny Norton and Donna Faust. Donna's husband Doug made his "first appearance since 1986" (or was it 1989?), at any event it was great to see new/old blood back in the mix. Rick Howitt and Doug shared Donna's boat, it was great having an extra hand on board to assist with a few rescues. Jenny (last name?) dumped once or twice, but she took it in stride. Gotta get your feet wet sometime! A few others including Donna Faust swam, and some other guy. Who was it...? JB

PS- Mike took a dip in the first race and yes, it brought a smile to my face"
