4 of 5 Great Lakes on the Rise, Levels rising toward long-term historic averages, reports say (The Detroit News): "The levels of four Great Lakes are higher than a year ago and all except Lake Ontario should start next year's recreational boating season at or above last year's levels, according to two reports this month. Lakes Michigan and Huron are predicted to be slightly above last year's levels to start this coming May, while Superior, St. Clair and Erie are expected to be about the same as last year, according to a six-month outlook issued this month by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Actual levels will depend in part on precipitation and how much of the lakes' surface freezes over this winter, a factor that limits water loss by evaporation.

Recent cold air has allowed ice to form on many protected areas of the lakes, according to the Corps report issued Thursday.

This week, Huron and Michigan are 10 inches above last year, Superior is up 4 inches, and Erie and St. Clair are both 1 inch higher. Lake Ontario is 1 inch below last year, the report says.

The Great Lakes gradually have been recovering toward long-term averages after near-historic low levels in the middle part of the decade."

The Ice Boom is in! An annual ritual here and no where else in the world, the ice boom across the end of Lake Erie was installed in December. This photo, taken by our friend Bob Knoer from his 18th-floor office in the Liberty Bank building, shows some late-season dredging in the foreground and the ice boom installation behind.

In September, the New York Power Authority broke ground on the construction of a new off-season storage site for the boom, at the foot of Hamburg Street, freeing up the existing acreage on the Lake Erie waterfront for development. This site will also be developed for a neighborhood park. Julie O'Neill talks about the new site: "We are grateful to the Power Authority, Congressman Higgins, Assemblyman Schroeder, Peg Overdorf and all our partners for their hard work in ensuring the Ice Boom's relocation improves public paddling and fishing access to the Buffalo River. This is an important step towards creating a green, accessible waterfront for the residents of Buffalo. We look forward to the full development of the Buffalo

River Greenway trail and park system."

You know how fast time flies: before you know it, the boom will be coming out of the Lake and it will be time, once again, to celebrate this ritual of spring with BoomDays! This three-day-long event celebrates the lifting of the boom with fireworks, cannon fires, EM Cotter journeys to the Ice Boom, reenactments, food, drinks, music, educational exhibits, a poetry contest, and the ceremonial dropping of the big, red, rubber ball. This year it will take place from April 15th to 17th. Keep an eye on the website www.boomdays.com for more information.

The Sabre 456 is coming: The Sabre 456 (ex-452) will make a come back in the summer of 2010. This fabulous Jim Taylor design is timeless. She sailed so well that most people would not believe she could compete boat for boat with the likes of the J46 but once the results were in, the Sabre 456 had shown her transom to most of the fleet.

In this new layout the forward cabin berth will be shifted aft to create an island berth forward for the owner. The owner's stateroom will also include a larger dressing area, more hanging locker space and more drawers for personal effects and gear. In her aft cabin the berth will be laid athwartships so that the guests too will have a queen sized mattress on their berth. They too will enjoy more standing/dressing space in their cabin.

1) Chutescoop, used very little, 30' long, 9" diameter - excellent condition, \$125
 (For your info the following info is from the Chutescoop site : Chutescoops are sized according to sail luff measurements (use the "I" dimension of the boat if the sail luff is not known). Chutescoop sleeves are supposed to be shorter than the sail luff. On cruising spinnakers, use a Chutescoop that stops just short of the leech clew (unless the measurement between luff length and leech length is excessively long). On poled spinnakers allow 3 to 4 feet of sail below the sleeve to permit the pole to be trimmed.)

2) Propeller, 3 blade bronze, 17 x 14, \$200 OBO
