Comments & Articles of Interest:

Problems with Ethanol in Fuel, by Tim Booth: "Don, I have been talking with marinas and fuel suppliers. Originally we were told that this would be a non E-10 summer. It now appears that the changeover will happen mid-summer, as early as June in some areas.

E-10 can be a major headache for boaters, both during the changeover and afterward. Getting the water out, and keeping it under control is absolutely critical for boaters. It is a much larger threat for boaters because, unlike their automobiles, boats have open vented fuel tanks that will be absorbing moisture right out of the air.

April 15, ALERT- LAKE ONTARIO, LAKE ERIE

This summer most marine fueling locations will be switching over to E-10 gasoline. Boaters need to prepare for this changeover.

Old gasoline formulations would not mix with water. If you had any water in the tanks it sat at the bottom. Unless it mixed with the fuel on a rough day you didn't know it was there. E-10 will change all that. When that water mixes with E-10 it can cause phase separation, and phase separated E-10 fuel is a real problem. At best your motor will run poorly, at worst it can ruin your engine. Eliminating and Preventing water contamination is the key for happy boating with E-10.

You need to start preparing for E-10 immediately. If you are able you need to remove existing water from your tanks. It is sitting at the bottom where you might have a drain plug. If no drain plug you might be able to siphon the water from the bottom. Remove any water until you see the fluid change color. If you can't remove the water then you need to start using K100 to encapsulate that water. Encapsulated water can't react with the E-10. Use an amount of K100 equal to the suspected amount of water. If you have no idea how much water you have then treat the fuel at the ratio of one quart of K100 per 30 gallons of fuel.

Another cautionary note. E-10 fuel has a much shorter shelf life than the older formulations. E-10 fuel shows noticeable deterioration after 30 days. Most boaters don't turn over their fuel that fast. You need to be adding a stabilizer to your fuel. K100-MG contains an enhanced stabilizer that not only helps eliminate phase separation problems; it also helps to keep fuel fresh.

K100 is not a new formulation. K100 has been eliminating water contamination problems for years. Over on

the East Coast we have been helping boaters deal with the E-10 threat for 4 seasons. Major marinas on the coast use K100 as their primary winterizing treatment, and offer it in their marine stores and on the fuel docks. The military uses it to keep their equipment ready to go at a moments notice.

If you have a diesel powered boat, don't forget about K100-MD for diesel fuel. It keeps encapsulated any water to eliminate conditions necessary for microbe growth. It adds much needed lubricity. And it helps to keep injectors clean. Less filter clogging problems, better engine life, less smoke, better performance."

Here is an article from Scuttlebutt on the same subject: This summer, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will decide on whether to allow a 50% increase in the amount of ethanol in the nation's gasoline supply, from the current E10 (or containing 10% ethanol) up to E15 (containing 15% ethanol). However, with testing data on the new "mid-level" ethanol formulation to be completed on only a small group of 2001 and newer model vehicles by this time frame, consumers with older cars, boats, non-road vehicles or gas-engine powered equipment may find that the fuel is not compatible or safe for use. -- Read on:
