What's New? by Don Finkle: I was supposed to write this week about our company cruise on the 73' Topsail Schooner "Spirit of Buffalo" but unfortunately the storm that day caused us to cancel the trip. The "Spirit's" season ended Oct 1, so we are planning to go early in 2010.

I got a call on Saturday from my friend Garth Hichens of Annapolis. He had taken his new Beneteau First 40 out for its first sail on Friday and he was ecstatic about the way the boat handled. They had about 20 knots of wind and he said the boat was a pure joy to sail, upwind and down. He raved about the stability and how quick the boat was. We can't wait to see it ourselves this week.

The New Hunter 39 is one of Sail magazine's 2010 "Best Boat" nominees.

This week four of us will be working the US Sailboat Show in Annapolis. Our schedules vary, but you can get in touch with us by cell phone once you arrive in Annapolis. We really hope to see you there. We are asked which display we work, and the answer is we move around the show and are never in one place. Generally the best place to find one of us is at the Beneteau display, which is easy to find and essentially in a central location. They can also reach us by cell, as can our other builders. We promised to continue with the "Boatshow Comments" thread we started awhile back, so here goes. This week we will discuss how to handle the actual discussion of pricing and purchasing at a show. Those dealers who are located near the show

actually do a lot of selling there. Their customers wait for the show so they can come and make their purchase. While we do take deposits at the show, we generally do not finalize deals there. There are many facets to a transaction of this scale and we like to work through all of those details with our customers. This is tough to do properly during a show, especially when the show is out of town. Generally this process is completed once we all get back home and have the time to do it right. The deposit locks in the specific boat or hull slot and pricing while we create the custom deal that is best for you. There are no two sales that are exactly the same, at least not here at RCR where we try to fit the boat and all of its equipment to you as opposed to vice-versa.

What about "boat show specials"? Most builders are trying getting away from this practice. It turned out that buyers were figuring the special price was the starting point for negotiation, leaving little room to work the trade or the other financial aspects of the particular deal. What a factory-announced "special" really amounts to is a forced discount that the dealer has to give, with much of the special coming from the dealer's margin. In other words, the builder tells you that they are going to announce the special and you must give it away at your expense.

Another problem with the "special" is that what is being given might not be what you really want. One exception to this is the Hunter Marine Fall Boatshow Special. This program offers a Free Mariner Package, which is a discounted package of the most important options. Boats are seldom ever ordered without this package, so it is a good deal.

So what takes the place of the boatshow special now? It is left up to the dealer to make his/her best offer to the customer, based on each set of circumstances. When all is said and done we end up giving up as much as we did before if not more, because in the current market we all must be extremely competitive to make a sale. However, how the discount is shown will depend on if there is a trade or not, if the boat is ordered or in stock, and other factors. So customers will be getting the best deal we can offer, but it may not be shown the same way as before because of the lack of a published "special". As always it is the bottom line that counts, not how you get there.

We believe very strongly in the matters of proper delivery and after-the-sale service. With the degree of complication in the typical new boat these days it is especially important that it be delivered properly and then followed up afterward to deal with the inevitable bugs that show up over time. There is no way to do this correctly from a long distance away. At a show you will run into sales people who want to sell you a boat regardless of where you are located and their ability (or inability) to do the job right. So be wary of what you are being told at a show. At RCR our brokers are closely monitored and compensated in such a way as to minimize the temptation to do the wrong thing.

Historically RCR has been very competitive and seldom if ever do we lose a deal on price. Our market is not as populous or as affluent as some others, so we need to land a high percentage of the available sales. Therefore we work hard to make sure our customers have no reason to go elsewhere. This philosophy has proven to be successful for us, because we continually rank high in terms of sales and service ratings.

The Annapolis show is still an excellent place to see and compare the most boats at one time, and in a fun atmosphere. The newest models are always targeted for introduction at this show. It is well worth attending and many customers come very year for the ambience of the area and to see and droll over the boats.

Haul-out time is at hand. A reminder to label everything we take for granted during the season, but after a long winter don't seem to recognize. A few tags used now will make spring launch a lot simpler. Be sure to open up compartments below to insure adequate ventilation to prevent mildew. Don't forget to pump out holding tanks and top off fuel tanks prior to haul-out. Empty your water tanks as well. Change your engine oil and filter, replace fuel filters and use Propylene Glycol antifreeze in engine and water systems. It's non-toxic and biodegradable and helps lubricate pumps and valves throughout engine and water systems during lay-up. Take a good look at your impeller and make sure you order a spare.
